

Continuous Line Machine Appliqué

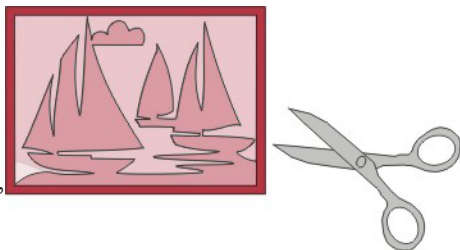

Cut once to make appliqué for 2 blocks. Here's how:

To make a single block (for a placemat or throw):

⇒ Trace the design onto the back of fusible web.

Using small, sharp, comfortable scissors start cutting at one end of the line. Cut, cut, cut, being careful to stay on the line, until you come out the other end. In other words, cut in one continuous line.



⇒ Separate the pieces. One is a positive and one a negative of the motif.



⇒ Fuse each onto a separate piece of background fabric. Two blocks from one cutting!



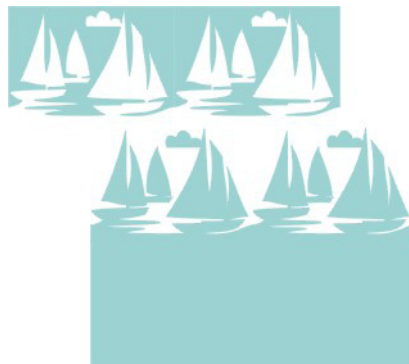
To make a double-block row (for a placemat or throw):

⇒ Trace and cut 2 continuous blocks.



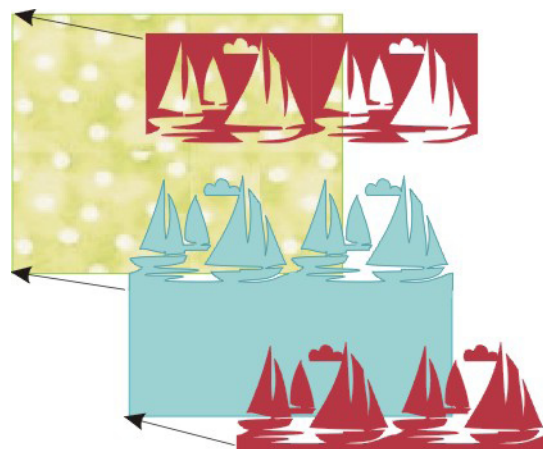
To make the wall quilt (note: construction for Hummingbird Vine & Dragonflies wall quilts is slightly different. See page 2)

⇒ Make a double-block row using the darkest fabric (see bottom of previous column).



⇒ Trace and cut 2 continuous blocks along the top of the medium fabric.

⇒ Position the components on the light fabric (the cutaway from the medium fabric is not used in this project).



⇒ For all projects, the appliqué is secured with a zigzag or decorative stitch, sometimes after the quilt is layered.

Continuous Line Machine Appliqué

Cut once to make appliqué for 2 Hummingbird Vine or Dragonflies wall quilts! Here's how:

⇒ Trace 4 blocks onto the back of fusible web. Cut in continuous lines. There will be more than one line to cut.



⇒ Separate the pieces. One group is the cut-away from the other.



⇒ Fuse each group onto a separate background piece. You get 2 quilts from one cutting.



⇒ The applique is secured with a zigzag or a decorative stitch after borders are added and the quilt is layered.
